January 6-10, 2010 (N=1,504)


September 30 – October 4, 2009 (N=1,500)



─Not too serious/Not a problem








Strong Partisan and Ideological Differences on the Seriousness of Global Warming

% who say global warming is a very serious problem






Is There Solid Evidence that the Average Temperature on Earth Has Been Getting Warmer over the Past Few Decades?

Yes, solid evidence of warming	57
Mostly because of human activity	36
Mostly because of natural patterns	16
Yes, but don't know why	6
No solid evidence of warming	33
Mixed/Don't know (Vol.)	10




Fewer Now Say There Is Solid Evidence that the Average Temperature on Earth Has Been Getting Warmer





And Fewer Who Believe the Earth is Warming Say it is Mostly Because of Human Activity


- Human activity, such as burning fossil fuels

Declines Across Partisan Lines But Especially Among Republicans and Republican-Leaning Independents


% who say average temperature is warming






Partisan and Ideological Differences on Whether Earth is Warming

% who say average temperature is warming






Age Differences in Views About Evidence of Warming and Its Causes






Little Differences by Education in Views About Evidence of Warming and Its Causes





From What You've Heard or Read, Do Scientists Generally Agree That the Earth is Getting Warmer Because of Human Activity or Do They Not Generally Agree About This?



Partisan Differences on Whether Scientists Agree That the Earth is Warming Because of Human Activity





How Much, if Anything, Have You Heard About The Disclosure of Private Emails Between Prominent Climate Scientists?




Thinking About What is Said in the News, In Your View is the Seriousness of Global Warming Generally Exaggerated, Generally Correct, or is it Generally Underestimated?






Partisan Differences on Whether Global Warming is Generally Exaggerated in the News

% who say seriousness of global warming is generally exaggerated in the news






How Much, if Anything, Have You Heard About a Policy Called "Cap and Trade" That Would Set Limits on Carbon Dioxide Emissions?








What Does the "Cap and Trade" Legislation Being Discussed in Congress Deal With?







Summary

- Global warming has remained a low priority for the public, especially as economic concerns have come to dominate their attention
- Many are not engaged with the issue and have given it little thought
- The issue of global warming has become increasingly polarized across partisan lines
- Even though there has been a decline in those believing there is solid evidence of warming, large majorities still support many energy policies that may help to reduce carbon emissions
